With the exception of James Munroe Duffy, the family was taken from the 1881 Canadian Census, Norwich North, Oxford South, Ontario

In 1876, Patrick Duffy owned property in Newark, Norwich North Twp, Oxford County. Concession & Lot: VI, 28 / Lot size: 100

In 1876, Patrick Duffy owned property in Mount Elgin, Dereham Twp, Oxford County. Concession & Lot IV, 1 / Lot size: 90

According to my source, altho the lots were in different townships, they basically abutted each other.

Israel & Lavinia Collins listed their religion as "E. Methodist".

James Munroe & Harriet Allen Duffy were listed variously as Methodist and Baptist.

I suspect Armina was a Methodist.

Hi Tim Duffie,

Congratulations on all of the work you've done on the Duffy family.

I've spent more than a few hours looking into the Duffy's of Oxford County, Ontario. You might be interested in some references relating to Patrick Duffy, father of James Munroe Duffy and of my great-grandfather Jerome Duffy.

In 2003, I spent a couple of interesting hours at the Woodstock, Ontario headquarters of the Oxford County Genealogical Society and visited nearby St. Peter's R.C. Cemetery, where many Duffys, including Jerome, are buried. While at the O.C.G.S. I looked at a copy of "A Registry of Baptisms and Marriages for Beachville, Woodstock, East Oxford, Windham, Norwich and Blenheim 1850-1853" and found two entries which refer to Patrick Duffy and Armina Collins.

The first entry in the Registry is a record of the marriage of "Patrick Duffy to Armina Collins (Protestant)," on August 16, 1851, in a ceremony conducted by a Father Monaghan witnessed by James Duffy and Mary Kelly. A James Duffy is buried with his wife Mary Kelly in St. Peter's Cemetery. (James & Mary Kelly Duffy: brother & sister-in-law to Patrick)

The second entry is a record of the baptism of a boy of three-months, "Gerom", child of Patrick Duffy and "Maria" Collins, officiated by anapparently semi-literate or at least hard-of-hearing Father Carayon on March 7, 1853. The sponsors? are recorded as "Ossum(?) Duffy" and "Alice Garvy." I believe that "Gerom" died in infancy or sometime before my great-grandfather Jerome was born in 1858. Clearly, Jerome was a name much favoured by the parents.

The O.C.G.S. also has a copy of a six-page undated typescript on the Duffy family of North Norwhich Township compiled by Mrs. Jacqueline E.Wilson. This document states that Patrick Duffy and Margaret McNally had four children: Sara (b. 1821; m. Edward O'Connor); James (b. 1823), Patrick (b. 1826?) and Francis (b.1832). Unfortunately, the focus is on Francis Duffy (Mrs. Wilson's line) and makes only passing reference to the other siblings. I also have some doubts as to the accuracyof the document (eg. Patrick's

birth date), but some of her information can be corroborated. Patrick Duffy (d. 1839) is buried in St. Peter's Cemetery with his wife Margaret McNally (d. 1848). She is probably one of the McNally's of county Monaghan who were the first Irish to settle in the area and who donated the land on which St. Peter's was built. James Duffy, Patrick Duffy and Edward O'Connor (Sara) all lived in close proximity in Dereham and North Norwich Townships. According to the Wilson typescript, Francis Duffy and family moved from Oxford County to Brooke Township in Lambton County in 1859.

I have a copy of the Wilson typescript and a transcription of the Registry of Baptisms, etc. which was produced by the Norfolk County Branch of the Ontario Genealogical Society in 1992.

I am continuing to search for Armina's burial place and expect to find it in one of the cemeteries in or around Brantford. Ontario .

Tim,

I found some info on the Duffie family in Hamilton. I find that the larger cities give up less info though. I know that William Godfrey Duffie & Lillian Maude Daniels are buried there in Chapel Hill Memorial Gardens Cemetery. William died May 5, 1972 and Lillian Aug 22, 1963. They had 8 children: Norma, Wilhemena Lillian, Audrey Leroy, Bruce Roy, Ronald Godfrey, Betty Ethelwin (1923- Jul 2006), William Blake, and Cifford Allen (Mar 30, 1917 - Apr 22,1971). I believe that William Blake and Clifford Allen are buried in the same cemetery as thier parents.

What I know about Allen Duffie is that he died Mar 1971 in Selkirk, Albany, New York. Not sure about Daisy, but if I remember correctly there is plenty on border crossings for her. Allen tends to give various dates for his birth, but I went with Mar 15, 1890 - since it was on the SSDI.

Ida Duffie married first to Alonzo Bruce Walker. They divorced before 1911. He was the step son of James McIntyre - known as the worst Canadian poet. Alonzo Bruce can later be found in Texas. Ida's second husband was Walter Hallam.

I think that is about all I know about the Duffie's that stayed here....

James Munroe Duffy

I verified his birth date by taking a memorial written by Ida Ethel Duffie Walker Hallam and entering it into a "date calculator". The number matched what I had from other sources: "In memory of James M DUFFY who died May 11 1892 aged 36 years 7 mos 13 days and his beloved wife Harriet E ALLEN born 1858 died 1933. Their daughter Ida Ethel HALLAM 1882-1976."

This was the time that our spelling changed from "Duffy" to "Duffie". Canadian birth registrations provide only a First & Middle name for the child. The parents are listed w/surname, so the assumption is that the child's surname is spelled as such.

On each birth registration that I have located, James and Harriet spelled their name "Duffy". Family rumors that GGrandmother Harriet AllenDuffy blatantly named her children "Duffie" on their birth certificates were not true.

Based on his birth registration, Grandfather Blake Monroe Duffie and his siblings were legally born "Duffy". Somehow the spelling simply changed over time, and the children of Blake Munroe Duffie and his siblings were the first legally spelled "Duffie" on their respective birth certificates.

With that duly noted, I will continue to use "Duffie" for each of the children of James Munroe & Harriet Allen Duffy since that is how they were known throughout their lives.

On Ida Ethel's marriage registration to Alonzo Walker, James Munroe signed as simply Munroe.

The 1891 Canada census listed the family as "Duffey".

Jerome Bonaparte Duffy

Buried St. Peter's Roman Catholic Cemetery, North Norwich Twp, Oxford County, Ontario.

Probably named after his uncle, Jerome Collins, brother of Armina Collins Duffy.
